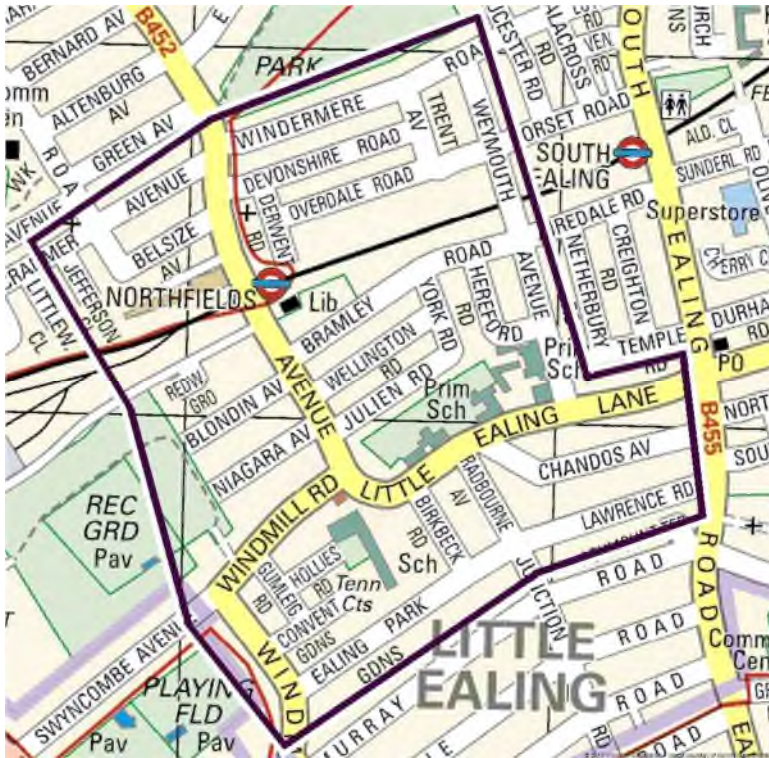

### About EFRA

Ealing Fields Residents' Association has been in existence since 1974. It covers the area stretching from Windermere Road in the north to Ealing Park Gardens/Lawrence Road in the south, and between Blondin Park/Northfield Avenue and Weymouth Avenue. We also work closely with the residents of the roads which border our core membership area, as so many problems are common to all of us.



EFRA exists to maintain and improve our local environment and to help create a sense of community in our local area.

We have had many successes over the years.

These include protecting residents' interests in court and at inquiries, stopping both unsuitable planning applications and preventing extended late opening hours for licensed premises.

We promoted the establishment of a nature conservation area in Blondin Park.

We also have an active Local History Group and have published local guides.

The Association is run by volunteers, is non-party political, and receives no public funding. Our Committee includes members with experience of dealing with a variety of local problems, both small and large. We are always keen to recruit new committee members and street reps.

### Why do members matter?

At an individual level you can alert us to concerns you have in your neighbourhood and help us with campaigns. The more members we have the greater the weight we have in our dealings with other bodies (Council, local businesses, etc.).

### What are Street Reps?

Street representatives act as a channel between the committee and members in their street: they deliver the printed newsletters and collect subscriptions. They are copied in on committee correspondence and are most welcome at EFRA committee meetings. The role is not onerous and provides an interesting insight into what is going on the area.
